## Outcomes and Impact:

- The project spanned 4 months (Nov'25 2025 to Feb'25).
- 53 Govt. Schools were impacted– Vrindavan & Jaipur.
- The initiative successfully reached 2,128 children.
- In total, 1,60,061 meals were served through this project.

My family also encourages me to eat school meals saying it gives us (children) strength. It has increased my physical and mental strength. All school days my lunch is MDM. On foot I reach school and return back home covering around 1-4km and I want aloo chhole also to be included in the menu". I feel good after eating my lunch at school, it gives me strength and allows me to focus.

# HelpAge India – Cataract Surgery Programme

IEX contributed Rs. 12 lakhs

## Outcomes and Impact:

- A total of 24+ screening events organized across 2 districts (Kanpur & Gorakhpur) and at least 24 villages were covered.
- Total of 2,708 patients screened, out of which 92.6% were aged 50 and above.
- Over 1,099 refractive errors were identified (approx. 41% of total screened), with 836 glasses provided – 76% coverage for those diagnosed.
- Total 402 eye surgeries were conducted against a target of 400.  
102 surgeries in Kanpur and 300 surgeries in Gorakhpur.





# Udayan Care Trust – Operational Cost for two IT Centers

IEX contributed Rs. 10 lakhs

IT Centers, (i) Bhangel, Noida & (ii) Loni, Ghaziabad

## Outcomes and Impact:

- Total 150 youth enrolled in courses such as Data Entry Operator, Tally Prime, and Digital Literacy courses at Loni and Bhangel IT Centers.
- 148 completed training; 75 secured jobs with monthly earnings of Rs. 10,000 – Rs. 18,000.
- 38 student led activities were conducted to support holistic development, including expert sessions and competitions.

### Sameer – student (Loni IT Centre)

Twenty-year-old Sameer grew up in Loni, Ghaziabad, with his five siblings. His father was the sole breadwinner, struggling to support the entire family. Due to their poor economic condition, Sameer's two elder brothers dropped out of school to work as sales boys in shops. However, Sameer always dreamed of having a formal office job. Despite the financial hardships, Sameer's father was determined to support his education. After completing his schooling, his father encouraged him to take a computer course. Aware of their financial constraints, Sameer knew that enrolling in a commercial institute was not an option. That's when Udayan Care's Loni IT Centre became a ray of hope for him.

Sameer successfully completed the Data Entry Operator (DEO) course at the Loni IT Centre. With the skills he gained, he secured a job at a travel company called "Sameer Tour & Travels" in their Delhi branch, earning a salary of Rs. 22,000 per month. Sameer's journey from a challenging childhood to becoming a financially contributing member of his family exemplifies the transformative power of education and skill training.

# Digital Empowerment Foundation – Digital Didi Program

## Outcomes and Impact:

- 1,000 women including girl children were educated about Menstrual Hygiene.
- Reusable sanitary pads distributed among these women to promote sustainability.
- Provided Digital Skills Training for basics of smartphone use and accessing online information.
- Imparted Financial Literacy on Digital payments, and fraud prevention.
- Trained participants empowered as educators through the *Digital Didi* network.



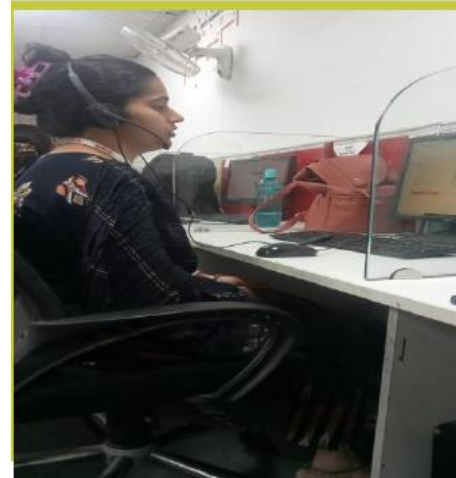


# Magic Bus India Foundation – Livelihood Training & Job Placement
